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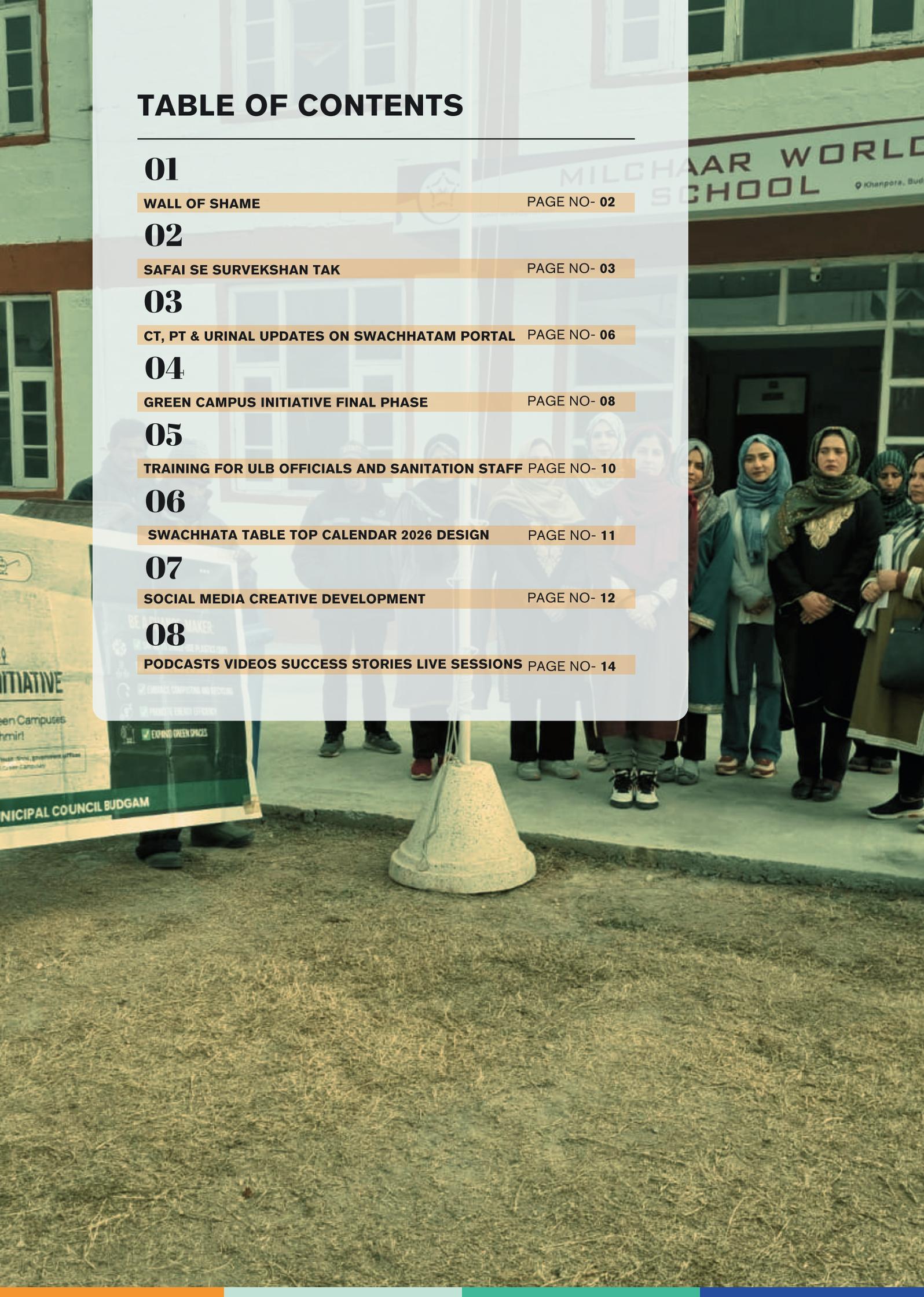

This initiative was designed to spotlight the negligence that leads to Garbage Vulnerable Points across our city. While the Wall provided a stark visual of the problem, the play—written and developed entirely by our own team—brought the human element to life, satirizing the habits and excuses that lead to littering. # Acceleration Drive for Swachh Survekshah-2025

### Strengthening Readiness through Focused Action

Safai se Survekshan Tak was a focused 30-day acceleration drive implemented across all ULBs of Jammu and Kashmir aimed at bridging the gap between service benchmarks and on-ground cleanliness practices while strengthening universal waste collection coverage and addressing long-pending sanitation gaps with special emphasis on eliminating garbage vulnerable points improving neglected city spaces and using technology-based monitoring along with community participation to enhance accountability sustainability and long-term impact. This month-long mission mobilized the entire administrative and field machinery to transition from routine cleaning to a rigorous, survey-ready sanitation framework that prioritizes visual cleanliness and service-level excellence.



## Key Highlights

✓ Expansion of door-to-door waste collection to previously uncovered urban pockets through systematic gap mapping and route extension.

✓ Transformation of chronic garbage vulnerable points (GVPs) into clean stable spaces with continuous monitoring to prevent re-dumping.

✓ Introduction of structured night sanitation shifts in high-footfall commercial zones to ensure markets are pristine before business hours.

✓ Intensive deep cleaning and revival of neglected back lanes and secondary arteries to ensure a 360-degree cleanliness approach across wards.

✓ Active citizen engagement through Swachhata Champions for real-time ward vigilance and immediate reporting of sanitation grievances via dedicated WhatsApp groups.

✓ Technology-based monitoring of collection fleets through the verification and tracking of GPS devices on all D2D vehicles.

✓ Operationalization of RRR (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) Centres across all ULBs to institutionalize resource recovery and circular economy practices.

✓ Door-to-door awareness campaigns tailored to specific gap areas to educate citizens on source segregation and responsible waste disposal.

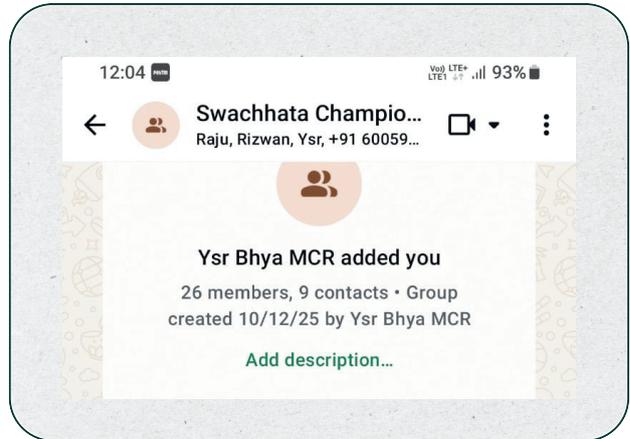
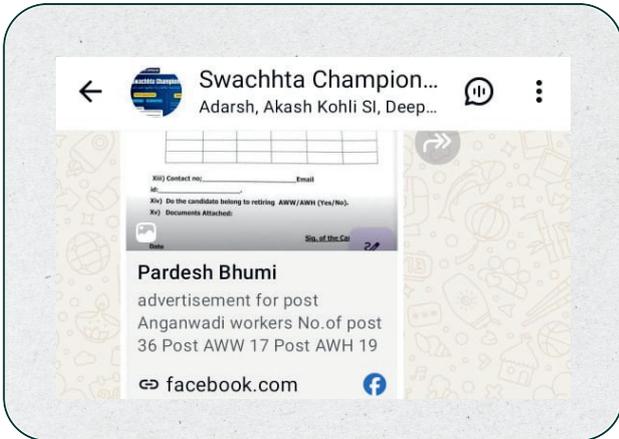

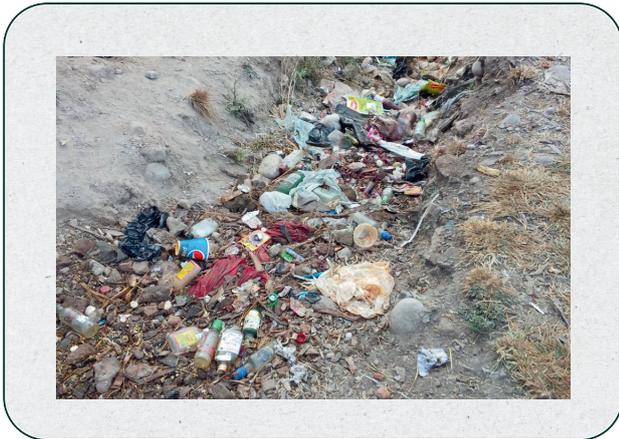

# Mapping the Sanitation Footprint

## Real-Time Asset Integration on Swachhatam Portal

This initiative involved a comprehensive digital audit and verification of the Union Territory's entire urban sanitation infrastructure to ensure a transparent and updated representation of assets in strict alignment with the Swachh Survekshan 2025 evaluation framework. By documenting the physical status and seat counts of every facility, the mission has ensured that J&K's sanitation progress is accurately reflected on the national stage. This digital migration allows for real-time monitoring of facility health and provides a reliable database for future infrastructure planning and resource allocation.

### Key Highlights

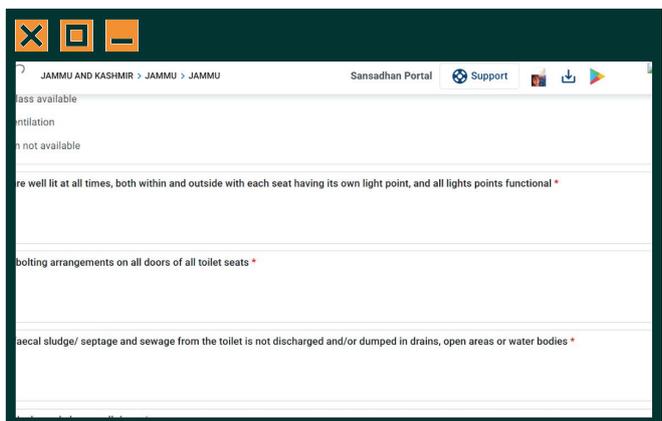
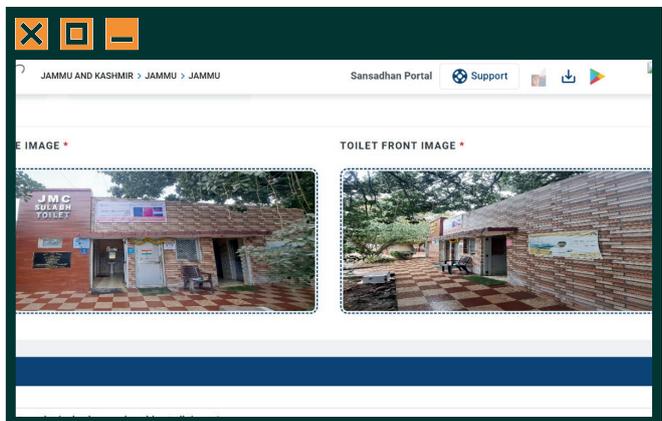
- Comprehensive mapping and status reporting of all Community Toilets (CTs), Public Toilets (PTs), and Standalone Urinals across 80 ULBs, ensuring no facility is left unrecorded.

- Systematic synchronization of seat counts and operational status to ensure 100% data integrity on the national Swachhatam Portal, facilitating accurate performance scoring.

- Ground-level quality checks conducted by field teams to verify essential hygiene parameters, including continuous water availability, functional electricity, and regular cleaning mechanisms.

- Strengthening the digital evidence base through high-definition geo-tagged photography and localized reporting to ensure high scoring during national-level sanitation audits and surprise inspections.

- Asset Accessibility Review to ensure that facilities are correctly tagged for specialized features like ramps and dedicated seats for the differently-abled and children.

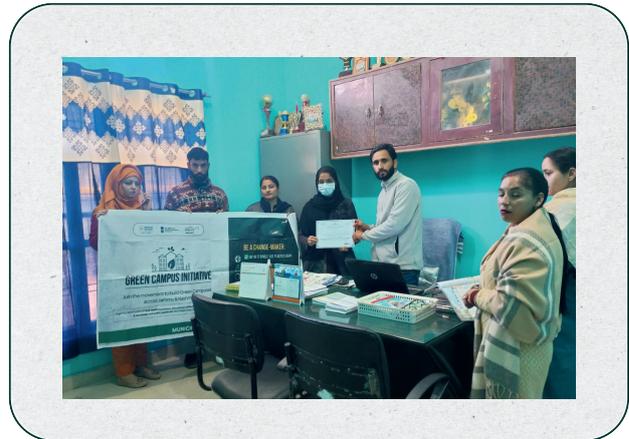

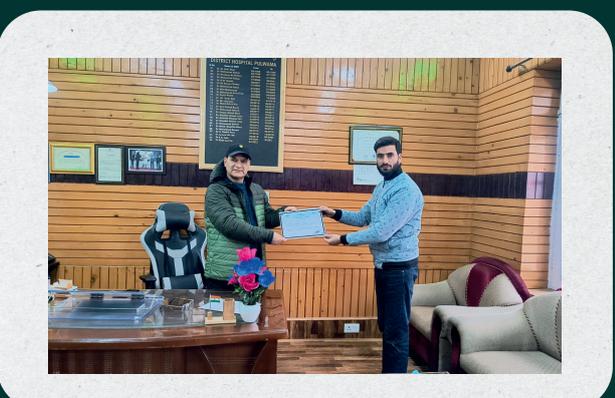
Leading the Way in Eco-Friendly Institutional Transformation

These campuses now serve as local beacons for sustainable waste management and environmental stewardship, demonstrating that large-scale institutions can transition to a circular economy model. This final push was designed to ensure that Bulk Waste Generators (BWGs)—including educational centers, government complexes, and hospitals—lead by example, providing the necessary momentum to achieve the national "Garbage Free City" vision.

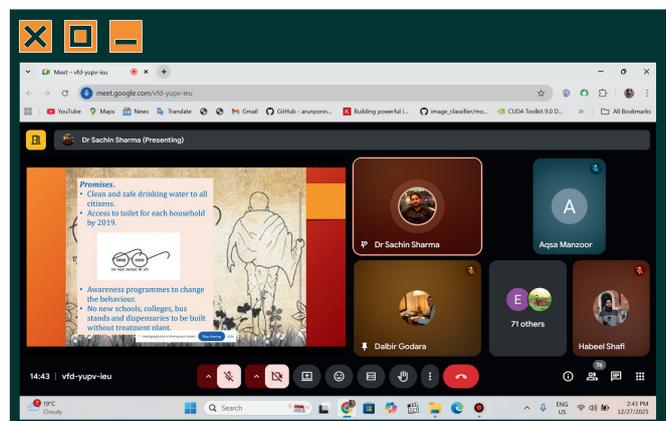
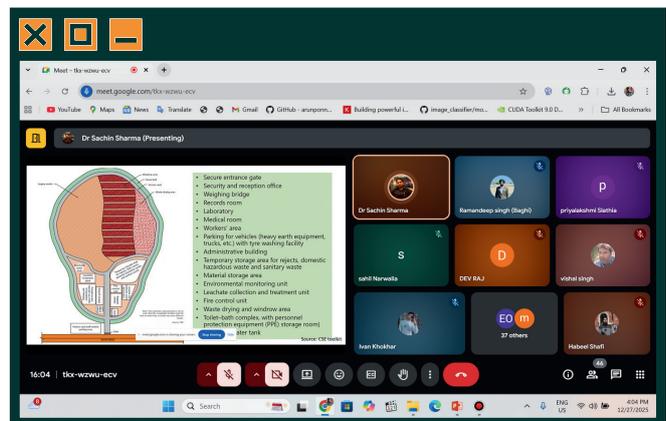

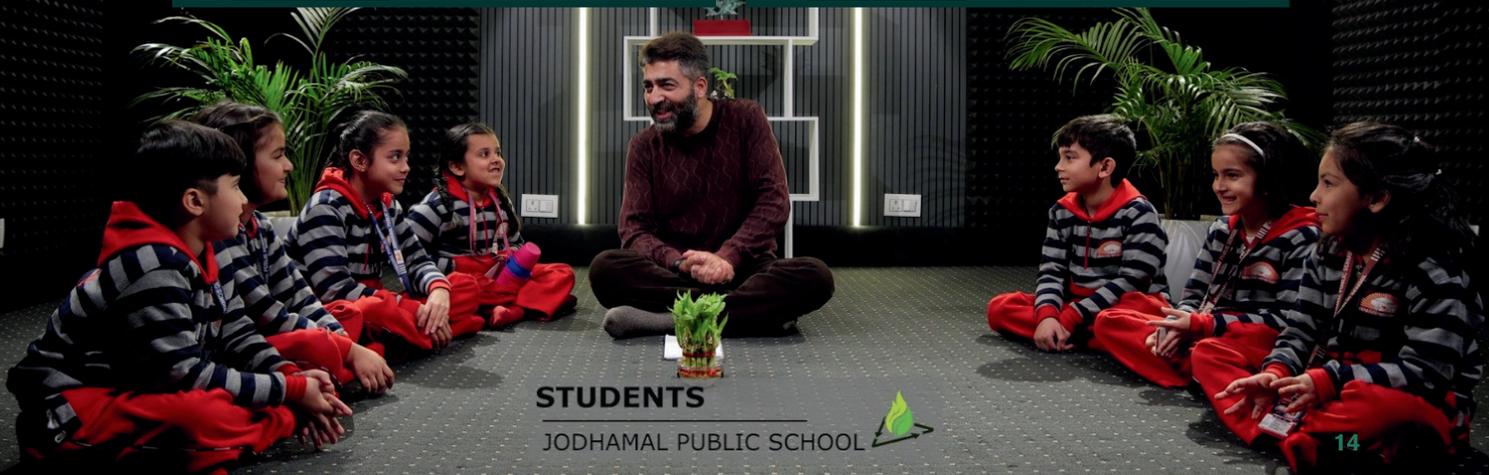
